Student Attendance

We know it has been tricky navigating the changing guidelines for student illness over the past few years. While we do ask that if your child is unwell, they stay home from school, we no longer have the quarantine rules of the past and we want to see your child at school as much as possible.

Regular attendance is a key contributor to student success. It is important to establish regular school attendance habits early.

We recognize as well, that sometimes families will be taking their child(ren) for holidays or vacations outside the school calendar breaks. I would like to stress the importance of contacting the school ahead of time to inform us. If you know your family will be going on a please holiday, email myself, <u>liana.james@tldsb.on.ca</u> as well as child(ren)'s classroom teacher(s) at least one week prior to your departure date with the length of your child(ren)'s absence. This is required to allow us to document their absence correctly and to help support them in staying up to date in their learning.

We look forward to working with families to help support regular attendance for all of our

students.

Student Belongings

We cannot stress enough the importance of labelling student belongings. Each year, we donate a lot of lost student items that do not get claimed. If your child's hats, coat, boots, mitts, snow pants, sweaters and water bottles are labeled, we can be sure to return them to their rightful owners. Otherwise, these items will be sent to our lost and found box, when the box gets full, we put all items out for display and have classes check them out to claim, and then remining items are donated. All of this can be reduced, even avoided if the items are properly labeled.

Personal items – we ask for personal items such as toys, collectibles (i.e., pokemon cards, hockey cards, stuffed animals), and personal technology to please stay at home. The school is not responsible for any lost items brought to school. We have found in the past that card/collectible trading often leads to conflicts.

As well, students should only be using board approved and provided technology at school. We recognize many of our older students bring cellphones to school. We discourage students from bringing a cell phone to school, but acknowledge that in some cases it may be needed for before or after school communication. While at school, students should not be using their cell phones. If a student is feeling unwell, requires materials from home, or needs to speak to a parent or guardian, they need to communicate that to their teacher and/or the office. We allow students to use the school phone to do so. Students using cell phones at school will have their phone taken and held at the office and returned to them at the end of the day.

We want to make sure that all of our students are focused on the learning taking place at school and often personal items can distract from this. We recognize that there may some exceptions, however these should be communicated with your child's classroom teacher ahead of time.



we know this keeps changing and it is hard for families to keep up. The best and easiest way is to go through the daily School Screening Tool. This is what we use in the office.



Pick-up and Drop-off

As many of you know, this is a very hectic time of the day, albeit one of my favourites! Our first priority is SAFETY! We know some families may be in a hurry, and we are doing our best to make the process move swiftly and effectively, but please keep in mind we have some young friends who are still learning the process and may need help embarking and disembarking cars. Some things to keep in mind when picking up or dropping off.

1.Do not pass in the pickup/drop off line, unless guided by a staff member to do so.

2. Yield to oncoming buses.

3.Exit to the right (out to Highway 7 directly), please do not exit to Tracey's Hill Road, as we do not have enough space for our pick-up line, cars exiting and buses entering.

4.Be considerate of our neighbours, please be sure to not block their driveways while waiting to pick your child(ren) up.

5.If you are changing a plan from bus to pick up, or from pick up to bus, please call the office in lots of time. Last minute changes make it very difficult for us to navigate where students should be going.
